End of Year Statements

Thank you for your generosity over the past year, which has made it possible to finance parish operations without interruption, to care for the facilities and property, and to enhance services and programs. When you use offertory envelopes or automatic giving (electronic funds transfer), your contribution amounts are recorded in the secure parish database. Loose cash and checks given in the collection are not recorded.

Each January, we use this information to create end-of-year contributions statements that are required by the Internal Revenue Service. Specifically, the IRS requires the parish to send disclosure statements for one-time contributions of \$250 or more and for quid pro quo contributions (made in exchange for goods or services). As a courtesy to our givers, we also will send a summary of all contributions made to the parish as recorded on the envelopes you use or the statements we receive about your automatic giving. Please consult with a tax professional if you have questions about charitable contributions and tax records.

PARTNERING WITH A PARISH IN HAITI

“....and the king will say to them in reply ‘Amen, I say to you, whatever you did for one of these least brothers of mine, you did for me’...” Matthew 25:45

The Archdiocese of Baltimore has had a relationship with the Haitian Diocese of Gonaives for over a decade. Cardinal Keeler designated Gonaives as a partner diocese of the Archdiocese of Baltimore. In 2001, Deacon Rod Mortel, M.D. was named Director of the Archdiocesan Missions Office. Cardinal Keeler asked him to expand the Baltimore/Gonaives relationship by developing a partnership program between parishes in the Baltimore Archdiocese and in the Diocese of Gonaives, Haiti. Baltimore parishes were asked to assist the Haitians with their feeding programs, education projects, and evangelization efforts.

Data on malnutrition, infectious diseases and illiteracy in Haiti are truly alarming; it is a desperately poor country not far from U.S. shores. Any help to relieve the daily suffering of hopelessness and the bondage of illiteracy can bring new life to this small nation where:

- One of every five Haitian children dies before the age of 5.
- Only 20% of those children who survive attend school because of the lack of schools and inadequate clothing.
- The illiteracy rate for adults in Haiti is 80%.
- The unemployment rate is around 85%.
- 90% of Haitian women have no profession or trade.

Twenty parishes in the Archdiocese of Baltimore have established one-on-one partnerships with a parish in Haiti, including St. Timothy's in Walkersville, St. Ignatius of Loyola in Ijamsville, Our Lady of Mt. Carmel/St Anthony Shrine in Thurmont, and St. Ann in Hagerstown. Holy Family Catholic Community in Middletown is also planning a partner program and we here at St. Joseph's are working with them to explore our mutual options and opportunities.

By participating in a partnership with a parish in Haiti, St. Joseph parishioners:

- Will have an opportunity to reach out to the poor and the needy to support the missionary mandate of the universal church.
- Experience life in and understand better the plight of a Third World country.
- Experience the culture of Haiti while working side by side with Haitian people.
- Will have opportunities for youth and adults and almost all of our ministries to participate in outreach.
- Will pray regularly for our sister parish in Haiti as the Haitian parish prays for us.

Next week I will provide additional details of the process we hope to embark on.
