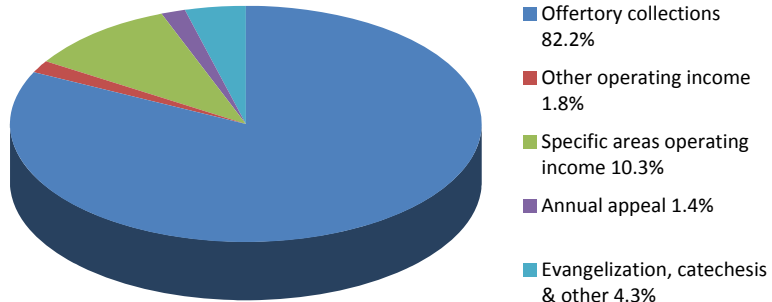

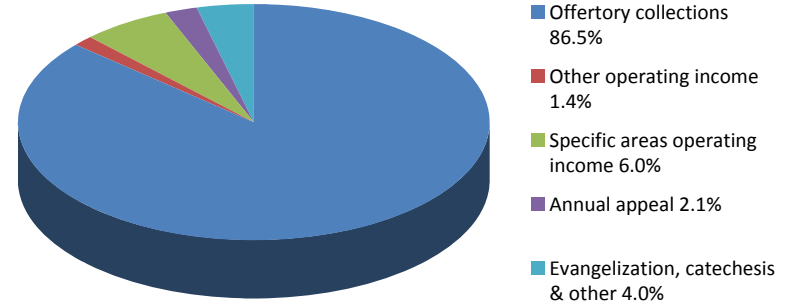

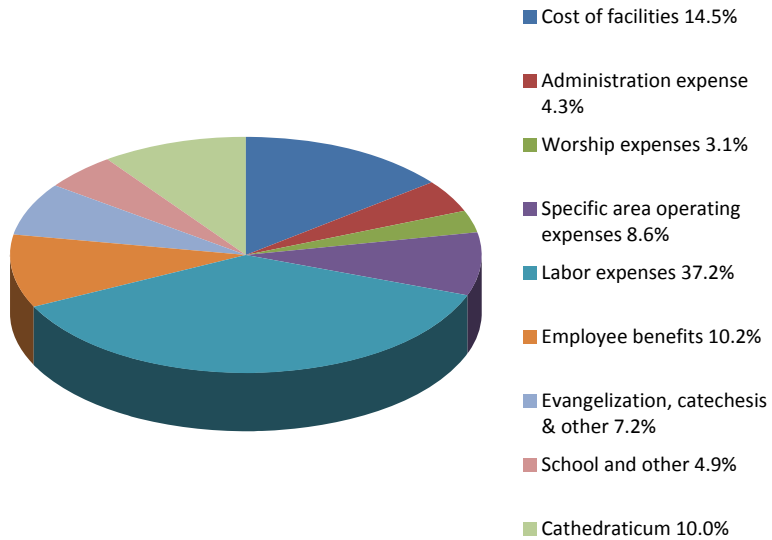
FY 2011 Revenues



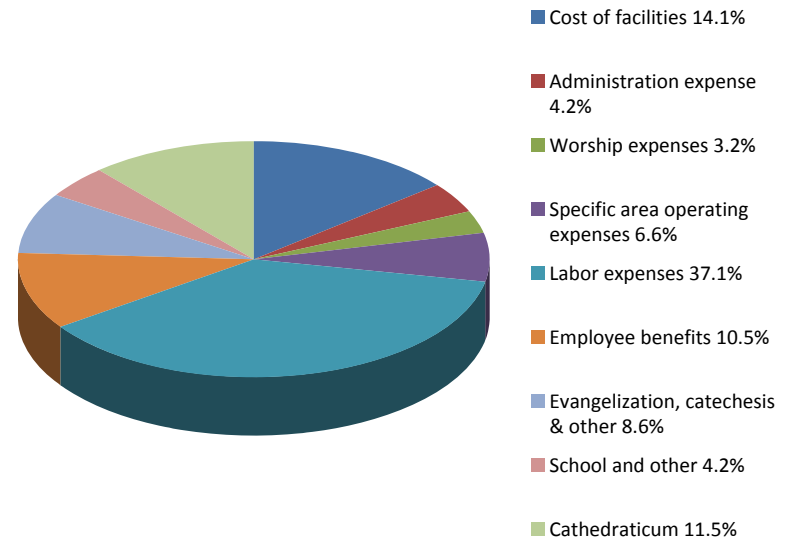
FY 2012 Revenues
