

Lenten Penitential Regulations

Fasting: All Catholics in good health from ages 18-59 fast on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday, by limiting themselves to one full meal each day. On such fast days, they may also take two smaller meals, but nothing between meals.

Abstinence: Catholics aged 14 or older abstain from meat on Ash Wednesday, Good Friday, and all the Fridays of Lent.

Catholic Penitential Practices

A sign of conversion of heart, penitential practices allow us to express sorrow for sin, help heal the rift sin has caused, and assist us in resisting temptation.

Penitential practices can take many forms, among them:

- Apologizing to an injured party
- Fasting during Lent
- Praying for the intercessions of the saints
- Reading Scripture, praying the Liturgy of the Hours, and every sincere act of worship or devotion
- Abstinence from the consumption of meat
- Fasting from food or drink, with the exception of water, for one hour prior to receiving Holy Communion
- Contributing to charity
- Stations of the Cross, recited individually or in a communal setting
- Practice of charity, especially toward the sick, the poor, the imprisoned, the infirm.

Act of Contrition

My God, I am sorry for my sins with all my heart. In choosing to do wrong and failing to do good, I have sinned against you whom I should love above all things. I firmly intend, with your help, to do penance, to sin no more, and to avoid whatever leads me to sin. Our Savior Jesus Christ suffered and died for us. In his name, my God, have mercy. Amen.
